GOLDIE GOLLIN MILLSTONE DIES AT 90; VOLUNTEER, PHILANTHROPIST

Goldie Gollin Millstone, whose volunteer and philanthropic efforts reached in many directions around St. Louis and beyond, died Friday of infirmities. She was 90 years old and lived in St. Louis.

She and her husband, contractor I.E. Millstone, were married for 67 years. The Goldie and I.E. Millstone Sanctuary at United Hebrew Congregation is named for the couple. So are several scholarships at Washington University, a classroom at Washington University's engineering school, an auditorium at Hebrew University in Jerusalem and a garden at Hebrew Union College there.

In the years before World War II, Mrs. Millstone helped save dozens of Jewish children from Nazi Germany by raising funds for a rescue group called Youth Aliyah. After the war, she turned her attention to the establishment of a Jewish state and raised money for Israel Bonds.

She was active in the United Way and played a leadership role in its women's division in the 1950s. She was also involved in the Jewish Federation of St. Louis and the Jewish Community Centers Association.

Later, she earned a certificate as a Braille transcriptionist and devoted countless hours to typing books in Braille - French and English - particularly for blind college students.

Mrs. Millstone was born in New York. She moved to St. Louis when she was about 7 years old when her father, Louis Gollin, an officer in Metropolitan Life Insurance Co., opened the firm's first office here. She was a graduate of Washington University.

Visitation will begin at 1 p.m. Monday at United Hebrew, 13788 Conway Road, followed by a service at 2 p.m. Interment will be private.

Besides her husband, survivors include their son, David Millstone of Waitsfield, Vt.; eight grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren. Her daughter, Mary Ann Millstone Kuhn, died in 1977.
